7/23	S6	Commercial Burglary, Theft by Credit Card	Between 6:00 PM on 7/13 and 9:00 AM on 7/14, unknown suspect(s) jumped a locked fence at a residential construction site in the 14000 block of Okanogan Court and took tools and a wallet containing credit cards, which were used a short time later to make fraudulent purchases for an unknown total loss.
7/24	S8	Non-Injury Collision	Occurred at 3:05 PM at Cox Avenue and Saratoga Avenue.
7/24	S2	Injury Collision	Occurred at 3:27 PM at Cox Avenue and Cumberland Drive.
7/24	S3	Possession of a Controlled Substance, Resist Arrest ARREST	At 7:59 PM, deputies were patrolling the area of Prospect Road and Saratoga Avenue and observed a bicyclist committing a municipal code violation. Deputies attempted to stop the suspect bicyclist, but the suspect fled. The suspect was ultimately detained and an investigation revealed the suspect was in possession of Methamphetamine, in violation of the suspect's probation terms. The suspect also had outstanding warrants, was arrested and booked into Main Jail.
7/24	S1	Non-Injury Hit and Run Collision, DUI ARREST	At 10:54 PM, deputies responded to a non-injury hit and run collision in the 12000 block of Pierce Road, on report of a motorist hitting a parked vehicle and a power pole before leaving the scene on foot. Deputies found the suspect driver hiding behind a tree a short distance away and an investigation revealed the suspect was driving under the influence of alcohol. The suspect was arrested and booked into Main Jail.
7/26	S2	Non-Injury Collision	Occurred at 4:06 PM at Sumner Drive and Claridge Court.
7/27	S5	Reckless Evading	At 7:43 PM, deputies attempted to stop a motorist driving against oncoming traffic at Saratoga Sunnyvale Road and Big Basin Way, but the suspect driver recklessly evaded and fled at high rates of speed. The pursuit was terminated and the suspect is unknown and at large.
